Within this spend the Trust uses numerous suppliers including specialist manufactures for items such as nurse call systems (Wandsworth, Aid Call, Static Systems, fire detection system (autronica), etc.

The Trust purchases a wide range of electrical products which would mostly be classed as consumables or are for general repairs or minor works. These including lamps, cable,

switches/sockets/general wiring accessories, batteries, fuses, general accessories (insulation tape, cable ties, etc).
