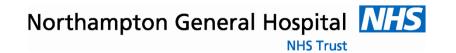

### A review of 2010-2011 Dr Gerry McSorley Chief Executive

### Key achievements

### A successful year

- All key performance targets met for the second year running
- Responded well to unprecedented levels of activity
- Further progress in eliminating hospital acquired infections
- Achieved financial targets

### Performance targets (1)

- A&E attendances up from 81,000 to 83,000 and target met
- Non-elective admissions up from 38,000 to 40,000
- 40,000 (84.5%) day cases, almost 8,000 elective admissions and 27,000 outpatient procedures
- National waiting time targets achieved for the third year running

### Performance targets (2)

- All nine national cancer targets met
- Continued to deliver diagnostic wait times of no longer than 4 weeks
- Year on year decrease in MRSA and C.diff
- Delivered a £1.1m surplus

### **Key achievements – for patients**

- Northamptonshire primary stroke centre
  - One of five in the East Midlands
  - Providing quick access to specialist care, including clot-busting thrombolysis when appropriate



- New interventional radiology suite
  - £1.2m investment
  - High-tech imaging system to guide insertion of balloons, catheters, microcatheters and stents



### **Key achievements – for patients**

- New laparoscopic equipment and three new laparoscopic specialist surgeons
  - High definition cameras and monitors
  - Patients recover more quickly and return to normal activity sooner
- £2m haematology upgrade and extension underway in partnership with Macmillan Cancer Care
  - Providing more treatment areas in a comfortable and relaxing environment
  - High level of public support
  - More than £700k raised to date
  - Due to open Spring 2012



### **Key achievements – for patients**

- New breastfeeding support service
  - 84% of new mothers start breastfeeding the highest rate ever recorded in the county
  - Trained supporters provide advice in hospital and at home



- 24 new ensuite facilities added across eight wards
- Wins a Building Better Healthcare Award





### Key achievements – award winning services

- National awards for:
  - Home birth team
  - NGH home birth rate is among the highest in the country



- 'Think Home First'
- A multi-agency project that won praise from a Government Minister and scooped both regional and national Health & Social Care Awards



### Recent service developments

- Designated as the vascular surgery centre for Northamptonshire from January 2012
- Community services beds in Isebrook Hospital,
   Wellingborough and Corby Community Hospital
- New short-stay elderly unit opened on Brampton ward

### Why we need to transform our hospital

In order to secure our future ability to deliver high quality care to our local population we need to:

- Continue to improve services whilst operating in a constrained financial environment
- Make the best use of our resources and provide value for money
- Make savings by improving efficiency every year totalling about £57m over the next five years

### Where we are in the process

- We have to save £18m in the current financial year,
   £12m in 2012/13 and £27.5m over the following 3 years
- All schemes are led by a clinician
- High level of staff engagement
- All schemes undergo a quality impact assessment

### Four priorities for 2010/11:

- Improving the patient experience
- Improve stroke services
- Improve the prevention of blood clots
- Continue to reduce infections including MRSA, Clostridium Difficile and surgical site infections

### Improving the patient experience

- Over 90% of all our patients are assessed to determine if they are at risk of falls or need help with nutrition
- Protected mealtimes
- Pressure ulcers serious ulcers reduced by 55%
- Patient experience improving ways of listening to patients

### Improve stroke services

- 97% of our patients received a brain CT scan within 24 hours of admission and all those eligible for clot busting drugs receive their CT scan in 1 hour
- Seven day service to assess patients with 'mini' strokes and give clot busting drugs (thrombolysis) to eligible patients
- Out-of-hours therapist service

### Improve the prevention of blood clots

- More than 90% of patients admitted to NGH are assessed to determine if they have a risk of blood clots
- Improved guidelines on the prevention of blood clots
- Patient information leaflets improved
- Measured improvement in standards displayed on wards

### Reduce all infections

- Low rates of MRSA infections only 2 cases last year
- 49% reduction in C. Difficile infections 48 cases last year
- Reduction in the rate of infections in wounds after operations
- Reducing and preventing infection is important to all NGH staff and they all receive training
- Executive directors undertake infection prevention reviews on each ward

### Our priorities for 2011/12:

- Right care, right place, right time
- Improving patient safety through junior doctor engagement
- Improving patient outcomes and speeding up a patient's recovery after surgery

## Financial Review of the Year James Drury Director of Finance

### Meeting financial duties

### All financial duties met:

- Five year cumulative surplus of £6million
- External Finance Limit
- Capital expenditure £0.8m under plan
- Capital Cost Absorption 3.5%

### **Financial Performance**

- Surplus of £1.1million
- Trust turnover up £8m to £236m
- Cost improvements totalling £10.4m

### Statement of Financial Position

- Capital expenditure of £10.2m representing investment in:
  - Breast screening facilities
  - Medical equipment
  - IT
  - Improved facilities
- Trust made use of a £0.5m interest free SALIX loan to fund energy efficiency initiatives
